SUBJECT: Special Assessments

INTRODUCTION:

The Community Development Department would like to be placed on the City Council agenda on February 19, 2015, to present a request to assess unpaid nuisance abatement costs totaling \$18,404.27 to private properties.

BACKGROUND:

The City's contractor has provided nuisance abatement services at the properties listed on the attachment. Dates of service range from May 2014 to January 2015. There are 75 properties represented in the attached spreadsheet. The City was billed for these services and has subsequently paid the contractor. Assessing the outstanding bills to the property taxes will help the City recoup its costs. Most of these properties are vacant and are routinely maintained by the City Contractor against nuisance violations for weeds and snow removal where applicable. Some of the properties are occupied, in which case the owner was billed for the services provided. Those who did not remit payment are included on the assessment list. A \$50.00 assessment fee has been added to each property to cover processing costs.

RECOMMENDATION/RATIONALE:

It is requested that Council approve the resolution to assess the unpaid nuisance abatement costs to their respective properties.
