Request for Approval to Submit the 2024 Certified Local Government Annual Report to the Iowa Department of Cultural Affairs

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

As a Certified Local Government, the City of Muscatine is responsible for submitting an annual report documenting the Historic Preservation Commission's work during the calendar year. The report is used to document that the Commission has met the requirements of the program and is in good standing. Remaining in good standing enables the City to pursue certain grants.

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION

The City of Muscatine has been a Certified Local Government (CLG) with an appointed Historic Preservation Commission (HPC) for many years. The HPC helps safeguard the City's historical, aesthetic and cultural heritage by preserving sites and districts of significance. Much of this work is accomplished through the establishment of historic districts, which also allows property owners to secure historic preservation resources for rehabilitation activities. Each nomination requires substantial study and documentation, activities often funded through state grants. Muscatine currently has three approved historic districts, including the long-established downtown, West Hills and Fair Oaks districts. Maintaining the CLG status also allowed the City to receive a grant to rehabilitate the Japanese Garden and secure the Bruhn Grant.

To be eligible for funding, the City must retain its status as a CLG, which includes submitting an annual report. The report provides information on Commission members and activities, City activities to support preservation, and private activity that may impact the integrity of historical resources. The Commission was able to meet 9 times in 2024. The group is reviewing applications for the City of Muscatine' Bruhn grant and anticipates assisting with future downtown façade projects. The group is supporting the City's current CLG grant, completing an

extensive survey regarding the connection of the City of Muscatine and Muscatine County to the Underground Railway. In addition, HPC and staff are continuing preparations to host the 2025 Preserve Iowa Summit June 5-7, and is evaluating grant opportunities for a new historic district or individual property nominations, and other partnerships with the Friends of Muscatine Historic Preservation and Muscatine County Historical Preservation Committee.

CITY FINANCIAL IMPACT

There is no financial impact on the City by approving this report. However, remaining in good standing does allow the City to pursue grants through the Iowa Department of Cultural Affairs for local projects.

The HPC for several months only had 3 members out of a 5 member commission making progress on projects extremely slow. The HPC is now back up to 5 members. The survey with the help of a consultant is almost complete. Focus will return to developing guidelines and standards. The HPC Friends group who helped with projects, fundraising, and etc has not been present or active so volunteers have been extremely hard to find.

The City of Muscatine received a Paul Bruhn grant to revitalize the Downtown Historic District. After a committee review and score the applications, the HPC made a recommendation to approve the applicants for preliminary review to the NPS. The City has also received several grants for the facade programs.

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
