Re: Education Coordinator's Report, August 2008

Our summer program has ended, and over-all it was a success. While overall enrollment was good, some programs did have their difficulties, particularly the teen and adult programs. Reducing the number of field trips to two this summer (one per month) worked well. Both field trips met their minimum enrollment. I think we should continue to offer teen and adult classes and will try to come up with new ways to promote them. As you can see from the numbers below, our class enrollment remains pretty constant. The increase in

outreach numbers is due mostly to the additional Project Insect tours and the very successful Ice Cream Social this summer.

Our Wednesday Kids' Workshops in August were Duffy De France's "Garden Sculpture" on Aug. 6 and Vada Baker's "Oil Painting for Kids: Monet's Water Lilies" on August 13. Both workshops were well attended and a lot of fun. Our August Family Days theme was "An Old Fashioned Picnic." The little ones, led by Julie Lear, created place mats complete with ants, a watermelon fan and a bumblebee flower holder. Vada Baker helped the older kids create Victorian "Curiosity Domes" complete with insect specimens. Amy Kling and Julie Lear took a field trip to the Muscatine County Courthouse, where they went all the way to the top of the tower and sketched. Our thanks to Leslie Soule from the courthouse and to Muscabus for providing our transportation. Vada Baker instructed students in creating an acrylic painting of a pond with water lilies on Aug. 7. Our last adult painting class of the summer met on Aug. 21. Students created a garden welcome slate using the one-stroke painting style.

On Aug. 4 Julie Lear and the Y Variety Arts group created paper sculptures inspired by the futurist artist Giacomo Balla, and on Aug. 7 she led the Y Teen Leader group in a potter's clay workshop. She repeated her sand clay workshop for the Hodgepodge kids on Aug. 13.

There were no formal tours scheduled in August.

There were no birthday parties scheduled in August.

Our fall brochure is out and we are taking enrollments. I am currently working on support of our fall classes and planning our winter semesters. Julie and I are preparing for Halloween at the Mansion and the "Sunday with Santa" event at the Festival of Wreaths. I am still working on re-writing the room descriptions for the mansion.
