REGULAR MONTHLY SESSION OF CITY COUNCIL

Council Chambers - June 5, 1980 - 7:30 p.m.

The meeting was called to order by Her Honor, Mayor Evelyn L. Schauland.

The opening prayer was given by Pastor Harley Schull of the Church of the Nazarene.

The Pledge of Allegiance was given.

Roll Call: Ald. Koehrsen, Rada, Hilton, Kemp, Duncan and Waltman present. Ald. Platt absent.

PUBLIC HEARING

Mayor Schauland stated the purpose of the public hearing was to hear citizen comments on the Third Year Community Development Block Grant Application in the amount of \$565,400 for the Franklin School project area.

A written petition against this application was received from Mr. and Mrs. Robert Pape, 407 West Second Street.

Mr. John Fifer, 1005 Iowa Avenue, was present to present a written petition against the application.

#4749. Ald. Duncan moved to close the public hearing. Second by Ald. Hilton. All ayes; motion carried.

PUBLIC HEARING

Mayor Schauland announced the public hearing was being held to receive input from citizens on the proposed rezoning of property owned by Omar Whitlow from R-3 Single Family Residential to M-1 Light Industrial.

Atty. Pete Petersen, 415 Iowa Avenue, was present representing Mr. Whitlow.

There were no written petitions for or against.

#4750. Ald. Kemp moved to close the public hearing. Second by Ald. Rada. All ayes; motion carried.

Mayor Schauland announced the Citizen of the Month is Bill French for many years of faithful service to the Boy Scouts of Muscatine.

PUBLIC HEARING

Mayor Schauland announced the purpose of the public hearing was to receive comments from citizens on the proposed Special Assessment of Houser Street Paving Project.

Mr. Bill Last, representing Marquette Home Club, stated that a survey of all property owners on Houser Street had been done by this organization and the results were as follows:

3.8% would accept the assessment without objection.

50% would accept the assessment with three objections:

- Engineering costs would be deleted from the cost to be assessed;
- 2. Sidewalk installation would be delayed for three construction years;
- 3. Any under bid would be shared between the City and property owners on a 50-50 basis.

46.2% wanted the street as it is with the embargo to remain.

Mrs. William Collitz, 3003 Lucas Street, stated that she and her husband were in favor of the paving project and were pleased with their assessment.

Mr. John Fifer, 1005 Iowa Avenue, stated that the City should have requested County and State Highway Commission to share in the cost of the paving.

Written petitions against the paving project were received from John Bird, 1312 Houser Street, and Carl Egger, 1304 Houser Street.

Mr. Bill Last submitted a formal objection on behalf of the Marquette Home Club stating that Houser Street is not a residential street and should not be assessed as such and that a 342% increase in the club's assessment over the last 6 years is intolerable.

- Ald. Duncan stated that he was against this lease because he felt beer should not be sold in City parks.
- #4773. Ald. Rada moved to approve the request for Central Soya to sublease the grain elevators on Mississippi Drive to Grain Processing Corporation subject to termination of this sublease on July 1, 1980. Second by Ald. Duncan. All ayes; motion carried.

City Administrator Wolff gave a report on the bids received for the construction of restrooms at Fuller Memorial Park.

Second by Ald. Kemp. All ayes; motion carried.

Rada moved to refer the petition to annex to the City from John Hintermeister to the Plan and Zoning Commission and request the Commission to obtain input and information from the County Board of Supervisors and representatives of the Sweetland Township. Waltman moved to approve the resolution accepting completed work and directing final payment to Rock Island Sheet Metal Works for renovation of the ventilation system at the Water Pollution Control Plant. Second by Ald. Rada. All ayes: Ald. Koehrsen, Rada, Hilton, Kemp, Duncan and Waltman. Motion carried and resolution duly adopted.
- #4783. Ald. Duncan moved to approve the resolution accepting completed work and directing final payment to Nott Company for the Bulk Lime Storage Facility. Second by Ald. Rada. All ayes: Ald. Koehrsen, Rada, Hilton, Kemp, Duncan and Waltman. Motion carried and resolution duly adopted.

Kemp moved to approve the resolution accepting the low bid submitted by Hanson Concrete Company of Washington, Iowa, in the amount of \$278,972.96 for replacement of the Isett Avenue Bridge over Geneva Creek. Second by Ald. Rada. All ayes: Ald. Koehrsen, Rada, Hilton, Kemp, Duncan and Waltman. Motion carried and resolution duly adopted.
- #4785. Ald. Duncan moved to approve the request by Muscatine Cablevision to request Iowa Department of Transportation for cable crossings and placements along and over State highways in the City of Muscatine. Second by Ald. Kemp. All ayes; motion carried.
- #4786. Ald. Waltman moved to approve the ordinance on first reading to increase landfill charges. Second by Ald. Hilton. All ayes: Ald. Koehrsen, Rada, Hilton, Kemp, Duncan and Waltman. Motion carried and ordinance approved on first reading.
- #4787. Ald. Waltman moved to approve the resolution approving and accepting right-of-ways and utility easements of the Oldfield Subdivision. Second by Ald. Duncan. All ayes: Ald. Koehrsen, Rada, Hilton, Kemp, Duncan and Waltman. Motion carried and resolution duly adopted.
- #4788. Ald. Hilton moved to receive and file communications received with the addition of the Minutes of the Levee Advisory Commission and a letter from the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific Railroad Company. Second by Ald. Koehrsen. All ayes; motion carried.
- #4789. Ald. Koehrsen moved to approve bills totaling \$524,271.91 and authorize the Mayor and City Clerk to issue warrants for the same. Second by Ald. Rada. All ayes; motion carried.
- Ald. Koehrsen reported on her attendance at the meeting of the Board of Water and Light Trustees on May 27, 1980.
- Ald. Koehrsen questioned what the status of hiring a City Attorney was. City Administrator Wolff stated that the deadline for applications is June 15th.
- Ald. Rada reported that he had received a request for a street light in the middle of the block on Webster Street.
- Ald. Rada stated that equipment is parked in the alley behind the 600 block of Leroy Street and that the road from Leroy up Amherst toward town is experiencing dust problems.

- Ald. Rada questioned where people who live in trailer parks should go during a storm. Mayor Schauland stated that Bob Fielder, the Civil Defense Director, is investigating this matter.
- Ald. Hilton questioned how long the embargo on Houser Street is to remain. City Administrator Wolff stated that the embargo could be lifted, but that the City will have to take all traffic off of this street during construction. Ald. Koehrsen stated that she felt a detour should be used during construction.
- Ald. Kemp reported that there is a weed problem in the vacant lot across from Brook Street Park and in front of the 1400 block of Park Avenue as well as junk in this location.
- Ald. Kemp reported that he had received a complaint of excessive noise on East Second Street past the Mark Twain Overlook and that citizens of this area would like to know when the noise ordinance would be enforced. City Administrator Wolff stated that he has received the contract for lease of the noise measuring equipment and a contact for training for police officers and judges.
- Ald. Waltman reported that he had received a complaint on speeding and noise in Sunrise Addition on Wier and Bidwell.

Mayor Schauland questioned what is being done on the residence at 315 Cedar Street. Steve Boka, Building and Zoning Administrator, stated that the porch has been removed and the property owner has been given 60 days to repair the remaining deficiencies.
