MUSCATINE CITY COUNCIL IN-DEPTH MEETING Council Chambers 7:00 p.m. - July 9, 2009

The City Council to Depth meeting for July 9, 2009 was called to order by Mayor Dick O'Brien at 7,00 p.m. Councilmenthers present were Press, Fitzgerald, Howard, Shihadek, Bynsm, Roby, and Lange.

The first item on the agenda was a review of the Grafiti. Ordinance. Nas Kelly, Safe Streets, began the discussion with a quick review of a draft Graffiti ordinance and the various elements of the context. The City Council asked many questions. Councilns an Shihadeh inquired about the burden this ordinance will place on the Police Department. Councilman Byrrum wanted to know about other funding opportunities to aid hiring additional staff (i.e. Code Enforcement Officer), He also asked about the responsi-bility of "Safe Streets" and "Keep Muscatine Beautiful regarding Graffiti enforcement/removal. Councilman Large wanted to know how the two Community Policing Officers (funded through an ARRA grant) would be used. He suggested that any additional personnel should be discussed during the budget process. Councilman Howard wants the Graffiti Ordinance but is concerned about the sarpower needed to enforce the ordinance. Councilman Fitzgerald requested an explanation of the distinction between Community Policing and the Gang Task Force. Councilworsan Roby inquired as to whether the two community officers will be sent to the Police Academy. She indicated her support for the ordinance. Musicatine Police Chief Gary Coderon was the chief spokesperson and accepted the City Council's questions. Jane Reischauer spoke in support of the ordinance by explaining that Graffit wandsinsn is harting Historic Preservation. Laura Liegois explained that "Keep Muscatine Beautiful" can help property owners victimized by graffiti vandals. The City Council agreed to direct the staff and Graffiti committee to move forward with finalizing the ordinance.

The next item was an update on the WPCP Construction Project. Bob Veentra, V&K. Engineering, addressed this topic. Mr. Veentra stated that the construction is 5-6 months underway. He provided a graphic illustration of what work has been done to date. He indicated the project may be behind but not by much. Councilman Howard asked if the paint issue has been resolved. He also wanted to know if this, project was impacted by Homeland Security. Councilman Shihudeh wanted to know how the project was progressing in regards to the budget. Mr. Veenstra answered the Council's questions.

An update on the Geothermal Project at the Public Safety Building was then given. Vic Amoroso, AJ. Associates, gave the presentation. Mr Amoroso, tabled we are on the downside of this project. Well drilling has been completed and removal of the parking lot will begin on Monday, July 13th. Completion date is schoduled for August 1st. He also detailed the Change Authorization Requests which have been processed. Councilivorum. Roly acland Mr. Amoroso answered all questions.

The next item on the agenda was a resolution accepting assements for the Mad Creek Lever improvement Project. Phase J. Sheve Boka. Planning/Zoning and Bulding Safety Director reminded the council that they passed a resolution accepting offers and disnations of property for the Mad Creek Lever project which allowed city staff to acquire the necessary permanent and/or temporary extensests from public and private property owners. The resolution before the council at the In-Depth meeting approved the executed exsensersts. Because of the Corps of Engineers timetable for bid letting and award of contact the Mascatine City Council was requested to formally act on the resolution ecopyting Essenserts. Councilman Lange saled if the costs shown on the resolution were estimated. Mr. Boka responded that they were the final costs. Resolution adopted.

Under comments, Councilmenther Press encouraged the citizens to participate in the cardboard recycling pro-
