AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 7 POLICE REGULATIONS CHAPTER 21 TRAFFIC: JUNK, OBSOLETE, STORED VEHICLES AND CHAPTER 22 TRAFFIC: STOPPING, STANDING, PARKING

Be It Enacted by the City Council of the City of Muscatine, Iowa:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. TITLE 7 POLICE REGULATIONS CHAPTER 21 TRAFFIC: JUNK, OBSOLETE, STORED VEHICLES Section 3 <u>Violation</u>. of the City Code of Muscatine, which currently provides as follows:

7-21-3 <u>Violation.</u> Any motor vehicle, trailer, boat, or other personal property which is found to be in violation of Section 7-21-2 hereof shall be ticketed for violation of such section by the police. The penalty for such violation shall be five dollars (\$5.00) for each twenty-four (24) hours that the vehicle is in violation of said section.

is amended to provide as follows:

7-21-3 <u>Violation.</u> Any motor vehicle, trailer, boat, or other personal property which is found to be in violation of Section 7-21-2 hereof shall be ticketed for violation of such section by the police. The penalty for such violation shall be ten dollars (\$10.00) for each twenty-four (24) hours that the vehicle is in violation of said section.

SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. TITLE 7 POLICE REGULATIONS CHAPTER 22 TRAFFIC: STOPPING, STANDING, PARKING Section 12 <u>Notice of Violation</u> sub-section (A) of the City Code of Muscatine, which currently provides as follows:

7-22-12 Notice of Violation.

(A) If a citation for a vehicle parked in violation of this chapter is returned to the police station within twenty-four (24) hours, the penalty shall be five dollars (\$5.00).

is amended to provide as follows:

7-22-12 Notice of Violation.

(A) If a citation for a vehicle parked in violation of this chapter is returned to the police station within twenty-four (24) hours, the penalty shall be ten dollars (\$10.00).

The fine for this violation is \$10.00 if paid within 24 hours of the time of violation. If not paid within 24 hours, a warrant will be issued for your arrest.

SECTION 5. REPEALER. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 6. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional

Re: Ordinance Amending Title 7 Police Regulations, Chapters 21 and 22

During the 2007/2008 Budget Review sessions it was proposed to increase the fine rates for parking violations included in the Police Regulations sections of the City Code. These violations include parking in prohibited zones, obstructing traffic, parking over 24 hours, parking on the wrong side of the street, parking in alleys, parking 2:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m., snow route violations, junk or obsolete vehicles, etc. These are tickets generally issued by the Police department that are issued throughout the City. Revenue from these violations is credited to the City's General Fund.

The current rate for junked or obsolete vehicles parked on the street is \$10.00. Fine rates for other violations included in these sections of the Code are currently \$5.00. These fines are proposed to increase to \$20.00 for junked or obsolete vehicles parked on the street and to \$10.00 for all other violations included in these Code sections. These rates have not been changed for 20+ years.

Please include the attached ordinance amending the fine rates on the agenda for the May 17, 2007 Council meeting for its first reading. The new rates will not be effective until the ordinance is approved on final reading and published as required. Time will also be needed after its final approval to order new tickets with the appropriate rates.
