The Muscatine County Board of Supervisors met in regular session at 9:00 A.M. with Howard, Mather, Sauer, Sorensen and Bonebrake present. Chairperson Sauer presiding.

On a motion by Sorensen, second by Howard, the agenda was approved as presented. Ayes: All.

Discussion was held with City of Muscatine Community Development Coordinator Adam Thompson regarding a request to approve Resolution #03-05-18-01 Abating Taxes. Thompson stated the City is in the process of getting rid of property it does not need. Thompson stated the adjacent property owner to the parcel had given an easement to the City for the Mad Creek Levee project and therefore lost parking spaces for their tenants. Thompson stated the City has added parking spaces on to their property and plan to convey part of the land to the adjacent property owner to replace their lost parking spaces. Thompson requested the Board abate taxes for 2018 and then after the land is turned over to the adjacent property owner the tax assessment would resume in 2019. On a motion by Howard, second by Sorensen, the Board approved the following utility permits: Eastern Iowa Light and Power – installation of a 330 foot underground cable at 1210 217<sup>th</sup> Street in Pike Township; and Eastern Iowa Light and Power – placement of new poles and boring for electric lines beneath a future culvert on Iron City Avenue in Section 9-T77N-R3W. On a motion by Bonebrake, second by Howard the Board approved Resolution #03-05-18-02 Authorizing Weight Embargoes on Secondary Roads in Muscatine County. Roll call vote: Ayes: All.

Discussion was held with County Engineer Keith White regarding a citizen's asking about the possibility of improving a Level B Road in order to build a hog confinement lot. White stated the citizen would improve the road at their expense and pay all future road maintenance up to the confinement site if the Board approved a proposal. White stated he was not asking for a decision from the Board at this time and was just making the Board aware of the citizen's questions.

White updated the Board on current road conditions.
